

## Solfege Duets - Treble Choir

Overview	In this lesson, students in Treble Choir practice 2-part sight reading examples by viewing a Google SLIDE presentation.
Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Computer with Projector or Smart Board</li><li>• <a href="#">Solfege Duets - Treble Choir</a></li></ul>
Instructions	<p>Teacher will project the Google SLIDE presentation on a screen in front of the class. Students will identify the key and time signature, clap and count the rhythms, and use solfege to sing each line.</p> <p>I recommend one slide per day, but that is up to you.</p> <p>Practicing sight reading daily will make your students better readers and musicians. If your students are not able to start with 2-part exercises, have the group sing each line in unison before they try to split into the duet.</p> <p>If this material is too advanced for your students, I have easier examples I have created that build up their reading skills sequentially. Email me for more information.</p>
