

Online Reputation and Cyberbullying

Overview: Using YouTube's curriculum students will learn short-term and long-term consequences of irresponsible social networking. Understand what cyber-bullying is and its effects.

Subject: Online Reputation and Cyberbullying

Grade Level: 9th grade in-class presentation (45-60min)

Materials: Access to computers with internet availability and use of projection screen for presentation.

Instructions:

Write learning objective on the board " I know what I want my online reputation to be and I know how to treat others respectfully online."

Use YouTube Digital Citizenship: Online Reputation and Cyberbullying curriculum as you feel comfortable with. Incorporate the *What Is Your Teen's Online Reputation?* article to demonstrate another consequence and discuss the Do/Don't recommendations.

Have students perform a google search for themselves and define what their "online reputation" says about them.
