Instructions for students:

For this assignment you will be using the computers, your Google Apps account, notes on Spanish speaking countries we've taken in class, creating a Doc, and using Google Search to help find information.

 First login to your Google account and create a Document titled like this: Class period - Your Spanish name and last name- Spanish Speaking Country Capitals Search Assignment

-example: P1 - Profe Maughan - Spanish Speaking Country Capitals Search Assignment

 Next create a numbered list 1-21 of every official Spanish Speaking country using our class notes for reference. After typing each country do a CTRL + Enter to create a new line under the country and type Capital: -example: 1. Argentina Capital:

- 3. Open a new tab in your browser (I've shown you how to do that already but raise your hand if confused) and go to google.com.
- 4. Using Google Search, identify the capital of each Spanish speaking country and enter it in your document. No need to save! Google Docs save automatically! -hint: one or more countries may have two cities listed as their capitals. If you notice this, list both cities and note what "type" of capital each is.
- 5. Double check that all countries have a capital (or two as the case may be)
- 6. When finished, to get graded and credit, you will need to "Share" your document with me via the blue "Share" button in the upper right corner of the Google Doc screen. Click it and find the "invite people" box. Type my name in the box, change my permissions to comment only, and send!
