Instructions:

Show students the YouTube created video on Copyright Laws.

YouTube Copyright School Video

Explain and show the difference between an owner's video and a non-owner posting the same material. Notice that on the first Yo Gabba Gabba video, the Yo Gabba Gabba team is the poster and owner. The second video, has been put there by someone else named Shaina Fukami

Yo Gabba Gabba! Licensed Video
Yo Gabba Gabba! Unlicensed Video

When using YouTube videos in an assignment for a class, you must be sure to only post videos by their owners. A good way to tell is by who posted the video, and if they have posted other videos.

Rubric: Check for understanding

- 2 Students are able to identify videos on owner's channels.
- 1 Students can discern real videos from fake videos, but not by channels.
- 0 Students cannot determine if a video is in violation of copyright.
